NEWSPAPER HIGHLIGHTS

- Punjab Chief Minister Amarinder Singh asked the Central government to be cautious on the contentious Sutlej-Yamuna Link (SYL) canal issue the focal point of a watersharing dispute between Punjab and Haryana, saying it has the potential to disturb the nation's security.
- Continuing tensions with China at the Line LAC could impact the government's decision on a major U.S.China auto plant deal in Maharashtra, with thousands of jobs on the line.
- The Supreme Court endorsed the PM CARES Fund as a "public charitable trust" to which donors contribute voluntarily. There is "no occasion" for the Comptroller and Auditor General (CAG) to audit a public charitable trust independent of budgetary support or government money.
- The National Tiger Conservation Authority (NTCA) has called upon the Madhya Pradesh government to review parts of a draft Bhopal development plan that proposed development of public institutions in tiger habitats which may damage them and cause human-tiger conflict.
- The century old Mysuru zoo has become the second Indian zoo to house the African cheetah, the fastest land animal.
- A joint IndoU.S. research study found that integrating depression and diabetes treatment ('INDEPENDENT') improved parameters for both conditions. The study was published in a recent issue of the peer reviewed journal JAMA.
- Cancer cases in the country are likely to increase to 15.6 lakhs by 2025 — a 12% increase from current estimated cases — based on current trends, according to the National Cancer Registry Programme Report 2020.

DWARF PLANET CERES GIVEN STATUS OF AN "OCEAN WORLD"

- 1. This status was given as scientists have determined that ceres has a brine(solution of salt in water) reservoir, making it "water rich".
- 2. Ceres is a dwarf planet which lies in the asteroid belt between Mars and Jupiter.
- **3.** Criteria for a dwarf planet are-Body Orbits around the Sun; Not a satellite of any planet; has not cleared the neighbourhood around its orbit; has enough mass for its gravity to pull it into a roughly spherical shape.

NAGAR VAN SCHEME

- 1. Recently, **Itanagar** has been selected for implementation of the 'Nagar Van' or Urban Forest scheme of Ministry of Environment, Forest & Climate change.
- 2. The scheme aims to develop 200 Urban forests in the country in next five years with a renewed focus on people's participation and collaboration between Forest Department, Municipal bodies, NGOs, Corporates and local citizens.

MILKY WAY LOOK ALIKE GALAXY FOUND

- 1. An extremely distant **look alike galaxy(named SPT0418-47)** of milky way was found, which is 12 billion light-years away from Earth.
- 2. A galaxy is a large group of stars,gas, and dust bound together by gravity.
- 3. Sun(a star) and all the planets around it are part of a galaxy known as the Milky way Galaxy.
- 4. Studying distant galaxies will help find answers to how galaxies formed and evolved after the Big Bang.

UK LAUNCHES £3 MILLION INNOVATION CHALLENGE FUND IN INDIA

- The fund aims to support scientists in academia and industry to tackle the COVID-19 pandemic and climate change.
- 2. Grants under the Fund are art of initiative under the Tech Partnership known as Tech Clusters.
- **3.** Tech Clusters will support the development of Indian Tech Clusters by breaking down barriers to growth, including building international links.

SAGAR(SECURITY AND GROWTH FOR ALL IN THE REGION)

- 1. Guided by SAGAR, India has dispatched technical equipment and material to Mauritius to help in dealing with the oil spills on its south-east coast.
- 2. SAGAR vision was enunciated by PM in 2015, which aims:To safeguard our mainland and islands, ensure a safe secure and stable Indian Ocean, and make available our capabilities to others.

GOVERNMENT EXPLORES INCENTIVES TO MAKE AGROCHEMICAL SECTOR ATMANIRBHAR(SELF-RELIANT)

- 1. Proposals include tax incentives, infrastructure development, import curbs etc. To boost domestic production in agrochemicals sector.
- India is the 4th largest producer of agrochemicals after US, Japan and China. India is net exporter of agrochemicals.
- **3.** However, India imports agrochemicals in their various forms worth over Rs 3,000 crore from China.
