NEWSPAPER HIGHLIGHTS

- A global ranking of personal, civil and economic freedom released placed India at 111 out of 162 countries. The Human Freedom Index 2020 ranked India 110 in terms of personal freedom and 105 on economic freedom, with an overall score coming to 6.43 out of 10.
- The Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) successfully placed into a transfer orbit India's 42nd communications satellite, CMS01, carried on board the PSLVC50, from the second launch pad of the Satish Space Dhawan Centre, Sriharikota Range.
- Bangladesh is a major pillar of **'neighbourhood** policy, Prime Minister Narendra Modi said at the inauguration of summit level talks held virtually.
- The Supreme Court said farmers have a constitutional right to continue with their "absolutely perfect" protest as long as their dissent against the controversial agricultural laws did not slip into violence.
- At a meeting of a parliamentary committee, members demanded the extension of the free foodgrain scheme started by the government as part of the COVID19 relief package. The scheme ended on November 30.
- Five political parties, including the ruling Aam Aadmi Party, collected ₹49.99 crore and spent ₹34.32 crore in the Delhi Assembly election campaign this year, the Association for Democratic Reforms (ADR) said in a report.
- The top U.S. general held unannounced talks with Taliban peace negotiators in Doha to urge a reduction in violence across Afghanistan.
- Turkey will not step back from its decision to deploy Russian air defence systems despite U.S. sanctions imposed on the country over the purchase. Stepped up Taliban attacks endanger the militant group's nascent peace negotiations.

GREAT INDIAN BUSTARD(GIB) CONSERVATION:NO AGREEMENT ON UNDERGROUND POWER LINES, BAN ON NEW PROJECTS

- 1.It is reported that Union Ministry of Power(MoP) and the Rajasthan government has rejected Wildlife Institute of India(WII) proposal to put all power transmission lines passing through GIB habitat underground.
- 2. Earlier, in 2019, on order of National Green Tribunal had suggested some recommendations to protect the GIB,
- 3. Mitigating all power transmission lines passing through priority bustard habitats by underground
- 4. Develop predator-proof enclosures in known breeding sites and keep away nest predators such as dogs, pigs, foxes and other species using professional trappers.

INDIA SEEKS TARIFF RENEGOTIATIONS AT WORLD TRADE ORGANISATION(WTO)

- 1.India has proposed to renegotiate bound rates, or upper tariff limits on certain items, reportedly information technology products, at WTO.
- 2. Move comes at a time when the Centre has been encouraging domestic manufacturing in select sectors through a production-linked incentive scheme under Atmanirbhar Bharat Abhiyan.
- 3. Tariffs are tax levied upon merchandise imports. Tariffs give a price advantage to locally-produced goods over similar goods which are imported, and they raise revenues for governments.
