The death of Cyrus P. Mistry, former Chairman of Tata Sons, in a car crash in Maharashtra's Palghar district has turned the focus on whether compulsory use of seat belts in cars — including by passengers in the rear seat — can save lives during such accidents. The seat performs many functions, notably slowing the occupant at the same rate as the vehicle, distributing the physical force in a crash across the stronger parts of the body such as the pelvis and chest, preventing collisions with objects within the vehicle and sudden ejection. B The Road Transport Ministry said that during 2017, a shocking 26,896 people lost their lives due to nonuse of seat belts with 16,876 of them being passengers.

The National Medical Commission (NMC) has written to all State Medical Councils, banning conversion therapy and calling it a "professional misconduct". 2021, Justice N. Anand Venkatesh of the Madras High Court issued a slew of interim guidelines for the police, activists, Union and State Social Welfare Ministries, and the National Medical Commission, regarding the LGBTQIA+ community, to "ensure their safety and security to lead a life chosen by them." B Parents too need to be sensitised, because the fi• rst point of abuse often begins at home, with teenagers being forced to opt for "conversion" therapies.

Preventive detentions in 2021 saw a rise by over 23.7% compared with the year before, with over 1.1 lakh people being placed under preventive detention, according to statistics released by the National Crime Records Bureau (NCRB) last month. Of these, 483 were the detentions under **National** Security Act, of which almost half (241) were either in custody or still detained as of 2021end. Over 24,500 people placed under preventive detention were either in custody or still detained as of 2021end - the highest since 2017 when the NCRB started recording this data.

Playfully chiding the Indian government for failing to deliver on the Teesta water sharing agreement, Bangladesh Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina on Monday said the treaty, held up since 2011 due to differences between the Centre and West Bengal Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee, was also holding up Hilsa fish supplies to India. "You [India] aren't giving us enough water, so I can't give you Hilsa fish right now.

V. O. CHIDAMBARAM

1.The Prime Minister paid tributes to freedom fighter V. O. Chidambaram Pillai on his birth Anniversary. Valliyappan Ulaganathan Chidambaram (V.O.C.) was born in 1872 in Ottapidaram, Tirunelveli district of Tamil Nadu. He is also known as Kappalottiya Tamizhan or 'The Tamil Helmsman'. He was a prominent lawyer, trade union leader, an Indian freedom fighter, and leader in the Indian National Congress (INC). **2.**He mobilized the workers of the Coral Mills, thereby expanding the social base of the Swadeshi movement. In 1906, he established the Swadeshi Steam Navigation Company (SSNC), which competed with the monopoly of the British India Steam Navigation Company.

3.He purchased two steamships, S.S. Gallia and S.S. Lawoe for SSNC and commenced first Indian shipping service between Tuticorin and Colombo against the opposition of the British Government and traders. He was charged with sedition by the British colonial government and was sentenced to life imprisonment. His barrister license was revoked. Political Life - Chidambarapillai supported Bal Gangadhar Tilak and the militant wing of the INC.

4.He participated in the 1907 Surat Congress with Subramania Bharati. He was one of the earliest to start the 'Dharmasangha Nesavuchalai' for hand-loom industry and the 'Swadeshi Stores' for the sale of India made things to the people.

5.He played a lead role in many institutions, like the "National Godown," "Madras Agro-Industrial Society Ltd.," and "The Desabimana Sangam". One of India's major ports, Tuticorin Port Trust, is named after him.

KURKI

1.A farmer, who had been sitting on a dharna against kurki orders for his land based on a court case filed against him by the local moneylender for defaulting on loan payment, had died by suicide. Kurki means attachment of a farmer's land, already pledged to the money lending institution or individual, in case of a loan default. Apart from banks, private moneylenders, commission agents also get these decrees against farmers from time to time.

2.Execution of kurki - Kurki orders are executed under Section 60 of Civil Procedure Code, 1908. The land which is pledged by the farmer to the bank or money lender gets registered in their name. In some cases, the land is auctioned as well. The process begins after the moneylender moves court to get kurki orders in case the farmer is unable to pay back his loan. In kurki, attachment of farmer's land as well as his tractor can be done as per the Section 60.

3.Attempts to ban Kurki - In 2017, Punjab abolished the Section 67-A of Punjab Cooperative Societies Act that enabled cooperatives to recover unpaid loans through auctioning of mortgaged land of farmers. However, Section 63-B, 63-C of the Act weren't dropped to prevent attachment of land. This was the reason that farmers keep getting kurki orders. A plea filed in the Punjab and Haryana High Court in 2018 sought complete ban on kurki.

4.Reality - Farmers point out that they are made to give post-dated cheques for loan, which are then used to get arrest orders issued in cheque bounce cases. Moneylenders also use promissory notes (pronotes) signed by the farmers in order to get kurki orders. "Pro-notes" are written documents taken from farmers, and signed by them at the time of giving the loan.

INFLATABLE AERODYNAMIC DECELERATOR

1.The Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) has successfully tested the Inflatable Aerodynamic Decelerator technology on a Rohini-300 (RH300 Mk II) sounding rocket from the Thumba Equatorial Rocket Launching Station. The Inflatable Aerodynamic Decelerator (IAD) is a technique used for an atmospheric entry payload.

2.An inflatable envelope and an inflatant (anything that inflates the envelope, like air or helium) make up the IAD. The IAD was

designed and developed by ISRO's Vikram Sarabhai Space Centre (VSSC). This IAD was made of Kevlar fabric coated with polychloroprene. Purpose - The IAD serves to decelerate an object plunging down through the atmosphere. It systematically reduced the velocity of the payload through aerodynamic drag.

3.Working - At around 84 km altitude, the IAD was inflated using compressed nitrogen stored in a gas bottle. Then, it descended through atmosphere with the payload part of sounding rocket. Once the IAD fell into the sea, it will get deflated by firing a deflation pyro valve.

4.The pneumatic system used for inflating the IAD was developed by the Liquid Propulsion Systems Centre (LPSC), Valiyamala. Significance - The IAD technology could aid cost-effective recovery of spent rocket stages and safely land payloads on other planets. It can also be used in ISRO's future missions to Venus and Mars.

ILO:WORLD SOCIAL PROTECTION REPORT 2020-22

1.ILO recently released a report specific to Asia and the Pacific Key findings: No access to social protection: Almost 53% of the population in the world has no social protection (56% in the Asia-Pacific and in India over 76% (Bangladesh has a higher % of people under social protection) have no social protection). Spending on social protection: World average is 12.9% (twelve points nine), while that in India is just 8.6% (eight points six) (Economic Survey 2021-22). India's social security spending: Lower than 5% of GDP per capita.

2.Recommendation: Follow a 'high-road' development path and make social protection inclusive. Basics: Social protection is designed to prevent deprivation, give assurance of a basic minimum income and protect the individual from any uncertainties. It includes measures related especially to old age, unemployment, sickness, disability, work injury, maternity or the loss of the primary breadwinner.

3.Few Government steps: Pradhan Mantri Jan Aarogya Yojana (PM-JAY); National Health Policy 2017; Social Security Code 2020; PM Garib Kalyan Ann Yojana (PMGKAY); One Nation One Ration Card; Atmanirbhar Bharat Rozgar Yojana, and MGNREGA.
